Rides with "Gray Lady II" A Message from the Pastor

It should be no surprise to you who have been reading the "Rides with "Gray Lady II" articles in the Messiah newsletters that there is regular commenting on our traveling about our community roads. "Gray Lady II" (my 2009 Toyota Tacoma pickup ministry partner) and I, do get to be about and see a lot of interesting driving skills and maneuvers. It is easy for us to get hypocritical of what we see during our trips. A couple of weeks ago, we had a parable from our Lord Jesus concerning a Pharisee and a tax collector. One was smug and stated: "God, I thank you that I am not like other people: thieves, rogues, adulterers, or even like this tax collector" (Luke 18:12) The other was a repentant tax collector who beat his breast in humility before the Lord and asked: "God, be merciful to me, a sinner!" (Luke 18:13)

"Gray Lady II" has taken me to task when I acted like the smug Pharisee. I could hear my own words flowing from my mouth after watching someone-else's lawbreaking driving with similar words to the smug Pharisee: "Boy, am I glad that I do not drive like that driver." In response to "Gray Lady II's" challenge which took me to task about my words and my own driving, a sense of humbleness flowed. I wanted them to get caught, yet, in my own cases of breaking a traffic law, I felt relieved that I did not get caught or caused an accident.

It is not always easy to traverse a community's roads, especially if one is not familiar with their roads. Instead of being haughty or smug, "Gray Lady II" told me I should be more understanding. It is not stretching the point too far, but some people in the midst of being lost, try to alter their plight to get to where they want to be illegally and unsafely. Also, there are just some people caught up in their own interest and with no concern for the other. They just do what ever they feel is right for them at the moment.

In reality, sometimes a person becomes lost especially when they are overly intent to get from point A to point B with no full knowledge of where their driving will take them. When I move from being smug when not lost, watching the actions of others struggling over the lanes, signs, signals and orange cones about them, to humility my view alters. In fact, I am relieved and even glad they made it through their errant moves safely. Not only for them, but for the others, who are sharing the same road.


I am also thankful, that by the grace of other drivers around me, when I am struggling with traversing the particulars of a roadway, they make helpful moves to rescue me. A case in point, when I was at my son's town, I had no idea about the signage and lanes of my travels until I got to them. My head was on a swivel trying to figure out where I was supposed to be as I was also looking for where I wanted to be. I had no former reference points to work with and traffic was moving at the assigned pace. In truth, I was in their way, but even as I made poor laned decisions, most gave me room to correct my errors of lane choice. I thank God for them and that all of us were not hurt or inconvenienced by my erratic driving.

Well, I have erratic (erring) moments in my life which I am thankful that my Lord covers me with His forgiving nature. There are times when I have been mortally lost but divinely recovered by the Lord in all His goodness and compassion. In humble appraisal, I have been blessed better than I deserve, in my own right. I thought the path at the particular moment was a good one, but had it revealed that it was erroneous. Fortunately, by the Lord's grace, He has brought me along to His glory.

This conversation brings to mind the so popular hymn about the Lord's never-ending or failing love which has its only purpose to safely bring us to His home. The hymn growing out of the faith transition and life of John Newton. He was lost in his early life as a sailor on a slave trading ship. It seemed alright for years and brought him a good income at the expense of the misery placed upon others. The Lord brought him out of that lost condition to one of being found. A grace upon understanding but available as our faith is awakened by Christ through His Holy Spirit. Praise be the truth for we fallen sinners from the end of the third stanza: "Tis grace has brought me safe thus far, and grace will lead me home."
