reminded me of the aroma which overwhelmed me of wet pine when we went for a morning walk when we stayed at Dulce many years ago.

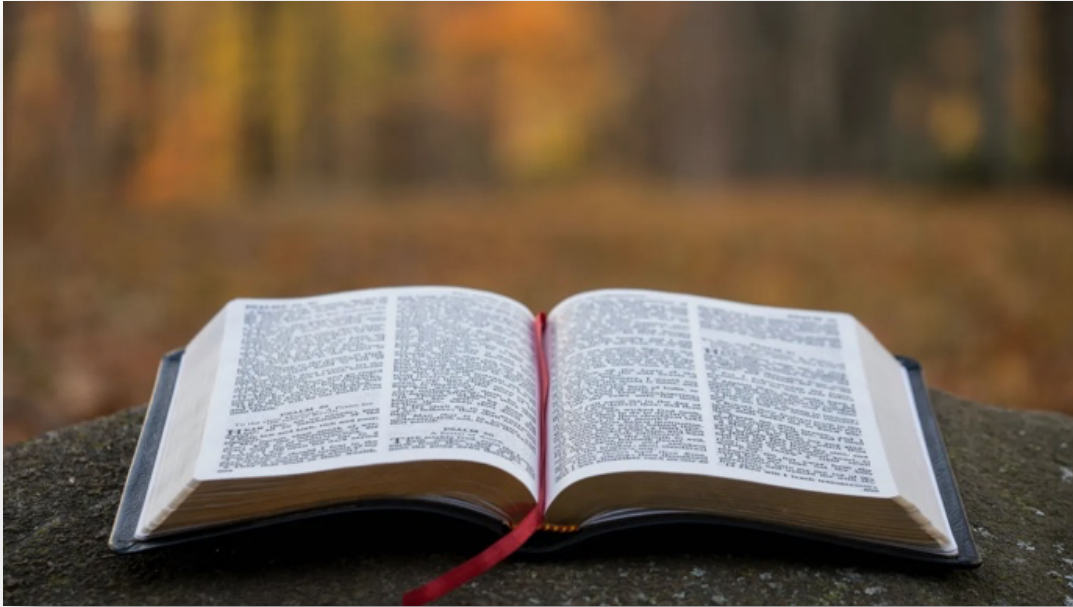


